British values

Pupil leaders were shown the posters that have been created and they discussed the positives of each one. A winner was chosen (Matthews design). This will now be made into large A3 posters to go up around the school to remind children of the importance of the school values.

Fundraising ideas

Reflection of this year.

Pupil leaders were asked to reflect on their time as a pupil leader and were asked the questions:
How have you helped other pupils this year?
How have you been a good pupil leader this year?

Their responses were:

"I have learnt that leaders need to think about the school and how we can make a change. I have focused on telling people about the importance of British values and what we need to do to make sure we are showing these in our lives. "We get to help people when they need to know things about bullying. We helped with this in an assembly" Sophie

" Democracy has been good, we have had a choice in school and helped make things happen" Sydney

" We have been good leaders because we talk to visitors and tell them all about our school" Amelia
