

Dear Families,

Here on Time Everyday!

At Nine Acres we know that children being in school, on time has a significant effect on learning. The more we are here, the more we can learn!



As a school we review attendance every week and monitor those children whose attendance is falling and where lateness is increasing and will contact parents/carers to see if we can offer any support with this. You could always contact the office to make an appointment with Mrs Hussey, our Family Worker, if you need a chat.

We know that sometimes illness happens! If this is the case, we do need parents to contact school by 9:00am and let us know and follow this up with a note when your child comes back to school. In the event of a medical appointment, a copy of the doctor's appointment card, a copy of your child's prescribed medication or a letter confirming a scheduled appointment is needed. We ask that routine appointments such as dental or eye tests are scheduled outside of school hours.

If we do not hear from parents/carers as to why children are not in school, this is recorded on the register as an unauthorised absence and will affect your child's overall attendance. We will also follow up further with partner agencies on that same day.

If your child has a minor illness they can still come to school and we will look after them! If in doubt, always send your child to

school. We can always give you a ring if anything changes during the day. We are happy to administer prescribed medication/ pain relief to help your child to feel better whilst they are at school. You will need to fill out a simple form in order for us to do this, please see the office for this. We have trained first aiders that monitor children who may not feel their best. We can check temperatures, provide quiet areas during break and lunch times and offer support to your children if they need to discuss anything.

In terms of keeping everyone fit and healthy, we encourage everyone to have a good hygiene routine. This includes having a good night's sleep, drinking plenty of water, regularly washing our hands after using the toilet, before eating and after being outside.



Being on time for school has a huge impact on children, in terms of their learning but also for the social aspect of school. Seeing their friends from 8.45am in the playground is a great start to the day! This helps children to feel settled when coming into school, they get to have the important catch up on the news and see their teacher before getting on with their learning. When children come into school late, they will miss this important part of the day, they normally feel rushed and anxious and will have missed out on some information from their teacher about what they need to do in class. This can create worry and upset and children might not understand how to carry out their school work. We will help and support all children with their learning and support them if they feel worried about anything, but being late really has an impact!

As parents/carers, it is your legal responsibility to ensure your child attends school regularly and on time. If there is continued non-attendance, this will result in the Local Authority issuing you with a fixed penalty notice of up to £120 per parent, for each named child. If this penalty is not paid, this may result in prosecution under section 444(1) of the Education Act 1996 for failing to secure your child's attendance.

This week 6 hours of learning time were lost due to lateness. This means that a whole day of lessons were missed.

The children often tell us that they want their attendance and lateness to improve for themselves and their friends. We hope we can work together to make sure all children get the best education and learning, attendance matters!


