It was a privilege to present 93 children with their 100% attendance certificates for the Autumn Term. Amazing achievement! Especially as Mrs Broome and Mrs Hussey met with our Educational Welfare Officer this week and although we are remaining slightly above the national figure for attendance we still have pockets where children are coming in as late as 9:30 in the morning! You can imagine how much learning is missed. Even coming in 10mins late every day equates to 50mins a week - a whole lesson! If you have any concerns or would like to chat through your child's attendance/lateness then please do not hesitate to contact Mrs Broome.

Over the next two weeks the teachers will be holding pupil conferences. This is a one to one meeting between the teacher and child to talk about their learning and set targets to support them in achieving their full potential. Our children are great at telling us what they like and don't like and by holding these individual conferences we are hoping this will empower them to take ownership of their learning.
