School values update

Pupil leaders discussed how the school value system is working. Leaders are enjoying working on each value and showing adults and other children how they are achieving these. They all felt that having them up within class has helped with discussions around this. British values

The leaders thought this would be a good idea to promote within school and felt that having posters of this across the school would really help. The leaders have been asked to design some posters and hand them to Mrs Broome by Wednesday 14th June and a vote will be undertaken for which poster will be made to go up around the school. Pupil leaders would also like the opportunity to promote this with the other pupils during an assembly. Pupil leaders will lead an assembly on 3rd July 2017.

Fundraising ideas

With the recent incidents of terrorist attacks in Manchester and London, the pupil leaders were keen to have another fundraising event. A few of the ideas that came up were: a disco, a competition or a mufti day. Another idea was to have a safety day where we could incorporate some competitions but have an emphasis on keeping safe. Mrs Broome encouraged the pupil leaders to discuss this further as a pupil leadership team and develop this idea further.

Safety in school

There is always an adult in the class and outside and we can talk to them if we are worried, they are really kind and they listen - *Matthew*

The grown-ups help keep us safe at school, they are trained to know what to do - Denna

When visitors come in they have to sign in and wear a badge so we know they are ok to be here - George

Adults listen and give us time to talk, that makes me feel safe - Asha

All of our teachers keep us safe, they talk to us about how to keep safe - Thea

Adults are trained in first aid so they know what to do if we are hurt - Dillon
