Year 5 - Summer Term 1 2019 - Ancient Greece



The first couple of weeks of the summer term we will continue to explore forces - investigating how

levers and pulleys have an impact on forces. Then, we will be looking at our local environment, observing living things in the school grounds. We will find out about the different parts of a flowering plant through dissection and then explore how different plants can reproduce by trying to grow new plants from different parts of the parent plant, for example, seeds, stem and root cuttings, tubers and bulbs.



English

Our book this half term is 'The Adventures of Odysseus,' which is a Greek myth, describing the journey undertaken by Odysseus on the way back from the Trojan War. We will begin by exploring the book using our comprehension and language skills. We will get to know the main character Odysseus through our inference and deduction skills. We will then be writing love letters from Odysseus to Penelope asking him to come home from the Trojan

War. After this, we will be writing non-chronological reports about mythical creatures. Finally, we will scribe our own Greek Myth using everything we have learnt about Greek Mythology and bring them to life with our amazing vocabulary.
