Our Religious Education this Half Term

This half term we will be learning about the concept of Change. 



Migrate - seasonal movement of birds and animals from one location to another.


Macaroni Penguin - live in Antarctica and are the largest of the crested penguins

Ruby Throated Hummingbird - tiny red and green migrating bird found in parts Central and North America. Weighs about 2–6 grams.


RSPB - Stands for Royal Society for the Protection of Birds. Is a nature conservation charity.
