Year 3/4 - Spring 2 2019- Theme: Misty Mountains

<u>Science</u>

How do we stand up tall and stay fit and healthy? In science we will be looking at animals including humans! We will be exploring nutrition, comparing and contrasting diets of different animals and researching different food groups and how they keep us healthy. We will also be looking at skeletons and muscles,

finding out how different parts of the body have special functions.



English - The Hobbit, Bear Grylls and Tales of Aventure



This half term we are going to be writing about a very famous person linked the Isle of Wight - Bear Grylls! We will be writing biographies about his life and imagining how it must have felt to have climbed Everest with some diary entries, We are also going to be revisiting setting

descriptions using scenes from The Hobbit as inspiration and we will also develop our description through poetry. We will also be developing our reporting style of writing with a newspaper report about a mountain adventure. All of our writing opportunities are going to give us an opportunity to keep developing our sentence structures and our use of punctuation for precision.

<u>PE</u>

Mathematics

We are also going to be interpreting data from tables and graphs so there will be lots of 'real world' application opportunities for our learning. We will then move onto calculating area and perimeter of shapes —

this will be a great opportunity to practice our multiplication skills which we have already worked on this year.



Theme

Have any of you ever climber a mountain? We will be learning about where some of the most famous mountain ranges are on a map and we will develop our map work skills. We will also be planning our own expedition to a mountain range using our ICT resources. Where will we end
