Contribution to the continuation of the Sport Development Teacher role	£4000	<p>To improve the teaching of PE by collaboratively working with teaching and support staff, identifying areas of strength and areas for development.</p> <p>Enhancing teaching staff subject knowledge and teaching of PE by modelling best practice, team teaching, carrying out observations and providing effective feedback that is specific to the needs of the individual teachers.</p> <p>To improve the provision of PE and Sport at Nine Acres Primary School, by developing schemes of work to ensure all areas of the curriculum are appropriately covered and to introduce an inter school competitions programme.</p>	<p>Individual improvement plans are being reviewed and progress meetings with teaching staff will identify where improvements have been made and where further improvement can be made.</p> <p>Contact time with all members of the teaching staff continue to show a positive change in the confidence of staff when teaching PE. This is particularly apparent in Key Stage 1 where teachers are more effectively planning and delivering PE with reduced input from the Sport Development Teacher particularly in gymnastics/games (Year2) and dance/gymnastics (Year 1).</p> <p>Schemes of work are continually being developed and updated to include diagrams and pictures where possible to make them easier to follow enhancing the PE experience for all children.</p>
EYFS Active Lifestyles Programme	£500	<p>Engage parents/carers to embed the healthy lifestyles message into family life by encouraging the parents to participate in the activity.</p> <p>Increase the amount of physical activity done by all children in Reception to help foster a love of exercise and the pursuit of a healthy active lifestyle from an early age.</p>	<p>The age appropriate games have provided the children with an exciting and motivating experience improving their coordination and balance skills. Teachers have also noticed that children have higher levels of spatial awareness and that they are able to negotiate spaces better. The weekly challenges have also promoted insightful discussions.</p>
