PSHE this Half Term

The children learn about looking after their friends. They will learn about caring for the world, exploring how to look after the environment. The children will then go on to learn about looking after money; exploring what money is, and the idea of savings. They will then go on to explore topics on Growth Mind set: including bouncing back when things go wrong , and the mind set of 'Yes I Can'.

Physical Development this Half Term

We will be doing P.E. with Miss Moseley and Mr Nash on a Monday and all children need to come in their PE kits. We will be doing lots of cricket based activities, re-capping different ways of travelling. We will also be practising sending and receiving with different equipment. Some of the children will be focusing on their gross motor skills with weekly sessions on the balance bikes. The children have opportunity to develop fine motor skills everyday through our provision, handwriting lessons and funky fingers activities in the mornings.

How can you help at home?

<u>Reading</u> - Please read at home with your child at least 3 times a week! Please record your children's progress in their reading records so we can help support them on their journey to becoming great readers!

<u>Maths</u> - Explore numbers 0-20 with your children. Model counting with your children, and embed helpful counting behaviours. Explore addition, subtraction and number bonds using numbers to 20. Focus on building numbers and patterns beyond 10, as well as spatial reasoning.

EYFS - Summer Term 1 2021— Growing

Important facts to know by the end of this topic:



- What animals come from eggs, and the different environments you may find eggs in.
- How to incubate an egg.
- How plants and vegetables grow, and what they need to grow.
- How to look after a chick.
- How bees help to pollinate flowers and plants.

<u>Key Skills</u>

Science

- Developing an understanding of growth, decay and changes over time.
- Understanding features of how environments may vary from one another.
 - Making observations of plants and animals.
- Talk about similarities and differences between families, communities and traditions.
- Recognise and describe special times or events for family or friends.

Key Vocabulary

Plants - Plants are living organisms that cover much of the land of planet Earth. You see them everywhere. They include grass, trees, flowers, bushes, ferns, mosses, and more.

Egg - an oval or rounded shell or outer case by which some animals (as birds, fish, insects, and reptiles) hatch out of as babies.

Pollen - is a fine powder produced by certain plants. During the spring, summer, and fall seasons, it is released into the air and picked up by the wind. The wind carries it to other plants so they can make seeds.

Pollination - the process that allows plants to spread. In

some cases, the wind and rain blows pollen between plants, which causes pollen to spread. Plants rely on bees and other insects to make this happen.
