## Year 6 - Autumn Term 2 2019 - Theme: HOME FRONT

#### English - Goodnight Mister Tom

Linked to our WW theme, our English sessions this half term will delve into fantastic literature which will support our understanding





of the topic and allow us to develop our writing skills in persuasion, emotion and story telling!

FIELD\_ On November 11th, we will start our journey by looking at the war poem 'Flanders Fields' and creating our own poetry to communicate the emotive messages that war brings.

In our main text 'Goodnight Mr Tom', we will be following the story of young Willie Beech who is evacuated to the countryside as Britain stands on the brink of the Second World War. A sad, deprived child, he slowly begins to flourish under the care of old Tom Oakley—but his new-found happiness is shattered by a summons from his mother back in London. This text will really push our reading skills by exploring new vocabulary, interpreting emotions and use of emotions by an author to impact on a reader. Extracts from



other texts we will also explore include: 'Poppy Field' by Michael Morpurgo; 'Letters from the Lighthouse' by Emma Carroll and 'Pax' by Sara Pennypacker.

Using all of these to give us inspiration, this half term we will focus on developing our writing skills by writing persuasive letters to


Neville Chamberlain, emotive letters from the perspective of an evacuee and then looking at stories with flashbacks in order to tell a soldiers tale of time at war. In order to complete these we will be teaching the children to develop their use of modal verbs, learn the correct use of subjunctive form and begin to practise the use of active and passive sentence types.



P.E. Sessions this term will continue to be on a Tuesday please ensure children have the appropriate kit in school.

### **Mathematics**

Pupils will be continue to practise arithmetic questions on a daily basis in Early Bird Maths as well as test technique with Miss Rowe and Mrs Michelmore on Tuesdays. We will learn about the outbreak of WWI, war propaganda, changes in women's jobs and technology, rations, the Blitz and evacuation—linking closely to our English text 'Goodnight




Mathematics
