- The Victorians had a big impact on the UK in terms of the laws and how we deal with crime and punishment.
- The first professional policemen, in England, were known as 'Peelers' or 'Bobbies'.
- Children who broke the law were treated in the same way as adults and went to prison.
- In 1838, Parkhurst was a prison for children with around 600 boys being held there.
- Nowadays, we have many more ways to identify criminals and find a suitable punishment for their crime. We also use many methods to stop people from carrying out a crime and make better choices.
