Year 1 - Summer Term 1 2020 - Why don't giraffes live on the Isle of Wight?

Important facts to know by the end of this topic:

Certain animals can only live in specific climates.

Desert animals such as gerbils and jerboas get most of their water from food.

Reptiles are cold-blooded so they need the warmth of the sun to make their bodies active.

Birds and mammals are warm-blooded so they can stay active even when the weather is cold.

Fat, fur and feathers are good insulators (meaning they don't allow heat to pass through) so they keep the animal warm.

Enquiry - We will be using our enquiry skills to answer our big question 'Why don't airaffes live on the Isle of

Wight?' thinking about hot and cold climates.



Locational knowledge -We will be using our locational knowledge skills and map work to locate where animals different live in continents.

Key Vocabulary

Warm-blooded - animals such as mammals and birds that maintain a constant body temperature.


Cold-blooded - animals such as reptiles, fish and amphibians that cannot control their body temperature.


