

Important facts to know by the end of this topic:


- 1. The Bronze Age is a historic period, approximately 3300 BCE to 1200 BCE The Iron Age was a period in human history that started between 1200 B.C. and 600 B.C. depending on the region, and followed the Stone Age and Bronze Age.
- 2. A hillfort is a type of earthwork used as a defended settlement, located to exploit a rise in elevation for defensive advantage.
- 3. Bronze and Iron were used to make jewellery weapons, cooking equipment and many tools to help humans with every day life.
