Key Vocabulary

<u>Island</u> - An *island* or isle is any piece of subcontinental land that is surrounded by water.

<u>Village</u> - a group of houses and associated buildings, larger than a hamlet and smaller than a town, situated in a rural area.

<u>Town</u> - a built-up area with a name, defined boundaries, and local government, that is larger than a village and generally smaller than a city.

City - a large town.


<u>Iropic of Cancer and Capricorn</u> - The *Tropic of Cancer*, which is also referred to as the Northern *Tropic*, is the most northerly circle of latitude on Earth at which the Sun can be directly overhead.

Our English this half term!

Our Mathematics this half term!

We are going to use our knowledge and understanding of fractions and apply it in the context of decimal numbers. We will learn about how decimal numbers arise and the place value in decimal numbers. They will then compare and order them, dividing one and 2 digit numbers to get decimals ones and apply these skills in problem solving and

reasoning.
