### Dear Families,

Over the next few weeks you will be receiving your Parents' Evening telephone time. Please do look out for this in your child's bag or give us a call if you haven't received it yet. KS1 and Year 3 appointments came home this week and Year 4/5/6 appointments will come home on Monday 23rd Nov. Please remember that at the time of the call it may come up as a withheld number due to the restrictions on our phone lines.

Next week, we will be holding our Pupil Conferencing sessions with your children in KS2. This is dedicated time for your child and their class teacher to discuss their learning and progress on a one to one basis and agree new targets to be worked on for the following weeks. This is something we have been carrying out for over a year now and has a marked impact on your child's progress as they take on responsibility for their own studies and progress within them.

I would like to make a big plea for reading at home please! We still have classes where less than 50% of the children are reading at home. We ask that the children read at least 3 times in the week and have their reading record signed by an adult at home and bought in to school on a Thursday to be checked. I cannot express how important this is for your child, not only for their reading ability but also for their mental health and well-being. That short dedicated time with you and within their family sharing a story can help build a child up on so many levels. Please help us and help your child!

I am so pleased to announce that together we raised £224.59 for the Poppy Appeal. What a fantastic contribution and fabulous community spirit as always at Nine Acres Primary #theschoolofchoice


All children should come to school in their PE kits on their allocated day.


