#### Dear Families,

What a great start back to the half term! It is certainly getting chilly outside so please remember to send your child in with a warm, named coat, hat and gloves!

I wanted to revisit our morning procedures with you as there seems to be some confusion. Can I reiterate that the start time of the day has <u>not</u> changed. We have only tightened up our in-school procedures to support your child with their learning.

As has always been expected, children should be on the back playground (Yr1/2/3/4/5) or front playground (EYFS/Yr6) at 8:45 am. Teachers will be out ready to greet pupils and chat to parents at this time. At 10 to 9 all the children should be in their class line and will be led in by their teacher or LSA (if raining then children will be led in at 8:45am). The classroom doors will then close and children will start their learning - this half term we are focused on Maths. Any children arriving after this time will need to go through the main office so that classes are not disturbed or distracted. A child will not be marked late unless they arrive after 9.00am however we will start learning before then so your child may miss out on learning! If they arrive at 9.00 am each day they could miss up to nearly an hour's extra learning a week!

I appreciate parents' understanding and support with this for their child. As always of you have any questions about this just pop and see me or a member of the staffing team.

Mrs Tingle has just launched the 'Book Tuck Shop' for the children. Each fortnight on a Friday, the book tuck shop will be open for children to buy a brand new book to read for just £2.00. All monies will go on ordering new stock and titles for the children. It is a great privilege for us to be selling brand new books for the children to keep and treasure.

In addition we are currently consulting on the possibly of extending the school day by 10mins for a 'Story Time'. We would like to have the extra 10mins a day just to read to the children. Thank you for your continued support in hearing your child read most evenings. With a packed curriculum we would love to put by just a small amount of time in our day to stop and spend time sharing a story with the children. There is something special about sharing a really great class story together. We are asking for parents' views on this and the deadline for response will be 12<sup>th</sup> November. We are also introducing 'Times Tables' to pupils in Year 1 upwards. Before this was only for KS2 pupils however we realise that learning these basic facts early on are so important. The children will be able to earn their badges alongside the older pupils. The Government states that all pupils by the end of Yr4 should know their Times Tables up to x12 and the related number facts. It makes sense to start earlier on- please practice them at home!

Your child will be bringing their curriculum leaflet home on Monday which will detail all the learning for next half term. Please look out for dates in the leaflet as well as keep an eye on the newsletter. We try to get dates in your diaries as soon as possible. The Christmas performance and Church dates are already booked so pop these in your diary and we will let you know when tickets go on sale.

News just in: We have won the Harris Family Cup as the school who has raised the most money for the Earl Mountbatten Hospice Schools Walk the Wight. Thank you to everyone who raised £2,939.90. A special well done to Thea in Y5 who raised £2,160.00 towards the event.

#### Story Time at the end of the school day!

The school is seeking ways in which we can further develop pupils' love of reading. Already we have discrete taught book club sessions, our superhero reading challenge, our reading swap mornings and our book tuck shop. We have also had several famous authors join us in school to inspire us. Together with you we know that reading unlocks children's education. The staffing team have been thinking of other ways to share and help children with their reading and we thank you for continuing to support us by reading at home with your child.

We would like to seek your views on extending the school day by 10 minutes for Years 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 so we can read a story to the children. This would mean that pupils in EYFS would be collected at 3pm allowing sufficient time for parents and teachers to share information on the day's learning and pupils in the other years would be collected at 3:10pm from their normal location.

In these 10 minutes the staffing team would read to the children and every class would have a class story book to share. There is something special about sharing a story as a class together and we want this for your children. Over the week this would increase reading time for your child by 50mins and potentially nearly 4 hours of extra reading and story enjoyment a month. This also ensures that there is a calm end to a busy day!
