

This useful website can tell you which games, apps and social media sites children are using the most. It can tell you how they work, what age children can be to access them and how safe they are to use. Net Aware uses an easy -to-follow system about what children could be exposed to on each platform using low, medium and high-risk metres. It can also show you how to keep your child safe whilst using the internet and the privacy settings that each app, game or website has and how to use them.

Signs of Bullying

The NSPCC lists the following behaviours as possible signs of bullying. This list is not exhaustive and a child may display other symptoms, but these are the most common;

- Belongings getting 'lost' or damaged
- Physical injuries, such as unexplained bruises
- Being afraid to go to school, being mysteriously 'ill' each morning or skipping school
- Not doing as well at school
- Asking for, or stepling, money (to give to whoever is bullying them)
- Being nervous, losing confidence or becoming distressed or withdrawn
- Problems with eating or sleeping
- Bullying others



What to do if your child is being bullied online

The NSPCC gives 6 steps to help your child if you think they are suffering from bullying online;

- Talk to them about bullying and cyberbullying
- Let them know who to ask for help
- Help them relax and take a time-out
- Report bullying on social media and online gaming (New Aware can help if you're not sure how to do this)
- Report bullying videos shared online
- Talk to your child's school or club







What to do if your child has been bullying others

It can be really hard to hear that your child might have been involved in bullying behaviour against someone else. There is support out there for you if this has happened and you aren't sure what to do! The Anti-Bullying Alliance had a great section on their website to advise you;

They suggest;

- Make sure your child knows what bullying behaviour is and why it is wrong
- ♦ Make sure your child knows they can talk to you, or to another adult if they are worried about bullying
- Help your child to realise that no-one has the right to pressure them into something they don't want to do this includes bullying others
- Make sure they are not bullying others in retaliation for bullying they have suffered find out if there is a wider culture of bullying in the school or environment where it's happened
- Talk to your child about information that is shared through social networking sites let them know that they shouldn't upload comments or images that could hurt someone else or pass on content that is designed to hurt someone else. Let them know most social networking sites have report buttons if they have seen bullying behaviour and they want to stop it.
- Make it clear that you do not tolerate the use of disrespectful and hurtful language and behaviour as a family (it's vital that you model this as parents)


Next Friday, 23rd Nov is a Development Day. School is closed to pupils.




Fruit and Vegetables
