Dear Families of Nine Acres Primary,

We have had such exciting news this week that we are almost fully subscribed for September 2021 for our OUTSTANDING EYFS! What a privilege that so many families have chosen Nine Acres as their choice of school for their child. If you know of anyone who hasn't sent in their primary school application yet do please let them know that we only have a few spaces left and are happy to chat to them over the phone so they can find out all about our wonderful school.

Thank you all for logging in (or attempts to!) to our very first Google meets and having a live session with your teachers! It was great to see you all! If you were having problems logging in please do not worry, we are all learning how to use this technology to help us with our learning. There are a few common issues that have come up that might be blocking you from logging in. These can be easily solved! (Please see the next page of this newsletter for some troubleshooting). It is expected that children attend these sessions as part of their education entitlement. A class register will be taken for each session held. If you find anything else that isn't working, please ring us and let us know.

The staff are busy looking through the returned learning packs after their quarantine and my goodness me we have been so impressed by all the children's hard work and even extra bits on top. We do ask that the provided school learning packs are completed before other self-directed activities are undertaken. This is because the school learning packs are aligned with your child's curriculum so it is important they keep up with the packs so no learning gaps are created as a result, especially so they do not fall behind their classmates when they return.

You may be aware that from next week all Primary School staff nationally have been asked by the Department for Education (DfE), to take a lateral flow test (LFT) twice weekly, in order to monitor cases of Covid-19 in schools, and to support us to stay open and our communities to stay safe. This is quite normal in other workplaces. To be very clear for families this is another added layer of protection and does not replace any of our other measures such as self isolation requirements. Children are not included in this testing regime only our adults.

The tests will be carried out twice weekly so that any member of staff who may be carrying the virus can be identified and asked to isolate in order to control the spread. Should a member of staff have a positive result, they will need to self-isolate. They will then have to go to a test centre to have a PCR test in order to

confirm the result. If this is positive the bubble which the children are part of will close for a ten-day precautionary self isolation period. This obviously has implications for all of our families who currently require a place at school. If your child has a place in school, we may need to ask you to keep your child at home at short notice. We will endeavour to get a message of closure to you by 7.30pm on a Sunday or by 7:30pm on a Wednesday. I sincerely hope that this development will help us to identify positive cases more quickly and break the chains of transmission both locally and nationally. We are all very much looking forward to the day when we can welcome all our pupils back in school and we can enjoy being together again. Let us hope that this testing regime makes this happen safely.

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
Make sure you are logging in with your child's log in details. Some parents were trying to log in with their Google account. Unfortunately this doesn't work as the classrooms have been set up for child access only. Please see the step by step guide that was included in the learning packs.


When joining the meeting, you will need to wait for the teacher to start the meeting and then join. Some people were so excited to join that they joined too early which then caused people to be asked for codes. This will be fixed if you join at that specified time as per the text message.

There were issues with some links to meetings - If you have logged in there will be a link either at the top of the screen that says 'meeting link' or in the comments section.

If you cannot find your class once you have logged in, you may need to add join the class manually. At the top of the screen (right hand side) you can click on the link that says join class, type in your class and this should then take you to the class where you can join the link.



Home Learning


Are you struggling with internet access for home learning?
