



Curriculum Overview

We promote the spiritual, moral, social and cultural (SMSC) development of all pupils at Nine Acres Primary School. We actively promote fundamental British Values. We have a strong school ethos supported by effective relationships throughout the school and a whole school commitment to our Vision, where all children are *striving for Excellence* every day. Pupils are encouraged to regard people of all faiths, races and cultures with respect and tolerance.

Through our SMSC learning we aim to:

- Enable pupils to develop their self-knowledge, self-esteem and self confidence
- Enable pupils to distinguish right from wrong and to understand and respect the civil and criminal law of England
- Encourage pupils to accept responsibility for their behaviour, show initiative and to understand how they can contribute positively to the lives of others
- Enable pupils to acquire knowledge of and respect for public institutions and services in England and their local community
- Enable pupils to acquire an appreciation of and respect for their own and other cultures, beliefs and faiths
- Encourage respect and tolerance for other people; discriminatory behaviour is not acceptable and against the law
- Encourage respect for democracy and participate in democracy and participate in democratic processes, including opportunities for pupil voice.

Cultural

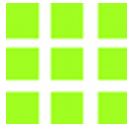
- National recognition of Language teacher

- RE curriculum with a focus on celebrating other cultures, with visits from leaders from different religions and visiting different places of worship i.e. churches, mosques.

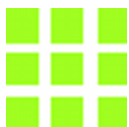
