





Nine Acres Governing Body Newsletter

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to the 2022 Spring Term Nine Acres Governing Body's newsletter. This term we, the Governing Body, have been working continually to support Nine Acres, the staff and the children and our commitment to the long term education of your children is unwavering. We meet on a monthly basis in order to review and give feedback to the Head.

The role of the Governors is strategic, and our job is to hold the Headteacher and Senior Leaders to account for the progress of your children. We also help to set the vision for the school. We ensure the funding is spent appropriately and, lastly, and most vitally, help support a robust safeguarding culture in the school. We have received regular updates from Senior Management as well as team leaders. This allows us to monitor the progress of the pupils and oversee how the curriculum is delivered.

We have continued to enjoy the visits from your children at the start of our meetings in order that they can give us feedback on how they, the students feel about life at Nine Acres. This term we had the pleasure of Year 3 and Year 5 children. These are important meetings for us. Getting to know the children who we support is a chance to really find out what the school is achieving and in turn how we can help the School reach its goals.

At most of our meetings, we have a subject presentation from one of the subject leaders. One presentation this term was from Mrs Shaw and Mrs Tingle on the choosing of a new phonics program. The board got to see the process the teachers went through in order to make sure that it was appropriate and within budget. We were impressed with the depth of analysis and research undertaken by Mrs Tingle and Mrs Shaw.

During our last meeting we broke up into groups and toured the school on a Learning Walk, looking at classrooms and all areas of the school. A Learning Walk is an important and fun part of our governing duties. Our feedback to the Head was very positive, most noted was how much student work was on show, and how each classroom had interesting and informative displays, all curated to help support learning. We were informed by Mrs Broome that a Music corridor is next on the list.

Training is an ongoing process and all of the Governors have access to online CPD training courses, either through the Hampshire Governor Services which offers direct Governor Training or the online learning platform Educare. George, who leads on Finance has taken several seminars including 'Understanding Finance in Maintained School', and 'Understanding Data in Primary School'. Both Laura and Miss Paddon attended an Ofsted Training Programme to make sure that all Governors are aware of the new Ofsted framework. From new Governor Induction training or refresher training on Safeguarding, each of our Governors make it a priority to be well trained and equipped with the skills needed to support the school.

The Governing board has been kept informed throughout the period that Mrs Dyer has been attending and supporting Holy Cross School, and the general consensus is that Nine Acres continues to improve even with some resources being dedicated to Holy Cross. We believe that is due to the strong leadership team at Nine Acres that is able to operate even when Mrs Dyer, Mrs Broome or Miss Paddon are off site.

This term we have been active in visiting the school and touching base with subject leaders. Carole has been regularly listening to readers in EYFS, been on a field trip with Y6 and met with Miss Bekesi in regards to History and Geography. Adam, who is the lead on Safeguarding, has had several meetings with Mrs Brame on staffing and has also spent time with the Site Manager checking the School security. Ian, the Vice Chair, has had meetings in regards to the new Ofsted framework. It is our role as Governors to understand how the school operates and how it works within the Ofsted framework. George, the finance Governor, has been reviewing the new Education White Paper produced by the Government, this paper outlines the Government aims over the next 10 years. It is important that we, as a Governing Board, understand any future changes that may affect the way Nine Acres is run or funded. As well as my regular meetings with Mrs Dyer, I also attended a feedback session from our LLP - Leading Learning Partner - from the Local Authority. The termly appraisal from the Local Authority is a chance for the School to have feedback on its current strengths and weaknesses.

Since January our Governing board has had three meetings, all in school, where we have the chance to see in person how the school operates. We hope this gives you a glimpse of how we are working behind the scenes to help the Headteacher and Staff deliver the best possible education for your child.
